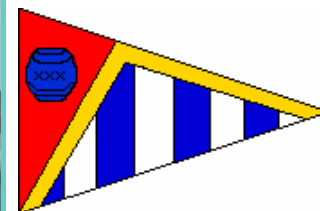

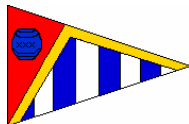
Newsletter Under Don Stark's, Marjorie Stark's, and Mac McDonald's leadership, South Hills has the best newsletter in the District, if not the nation.

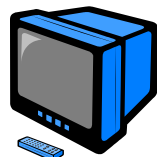
And Tom Merritt will now be organizing the programs at our regular 2nd Wednesday membership meetings, so keep the ideas coming to him.
