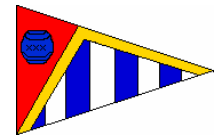

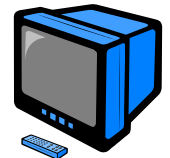

Linda Parker won the 50/50 raffle. Mitchell Parker, Warren Bell, and Dave Bonta won books, which had been donated by Selden Campen.

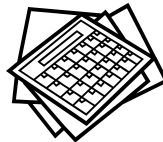
The meeting adjourned at 2100.

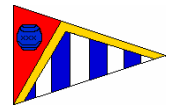
